## Key Vocabulary:

**Aerial photograph:** When we look at something from above we call this an 'aerial view'.

**Longitude:** measures distance east or west of the prime meridian.

**Latitude:** measures the distance north or south of the equator.

**Topography:** the study of the land surface.

**Seasons:** The four seasons—spring, summer, autumn, and winter.
