Continent	A large solid area of land.
Country	Land that has its own government.
Capital City	A city where the government is.
Ocean	Large bodies of salt water.
Sea	Smaller bodies of salt water between the ocean and land.
Cliff	A steep rock face.
Coast	The area where sea and land meet.
City	Bigger than a town.
Town	Bigger than a village.
Village	A community with a small number of houses.
Port	A landing place for ships on a coast, river or lake
Harbour	A deep body of water that protects boats near land.
Mountain	Higher than hills made up of rock and earth.
Human geography features	Things all around us that have been built by people.
Physical geography features	Natural things we can see all around us.
